June is National Adopt a Cat Month and at Nevada Humane Society we are celebrating cats and cat adoption by waiving adoption fees waived for cats over six months old.

“There are so many wonderful cats to choose from— young cats, old cats, Calico cats, Siamese cats, short-haired cats, long-haired cats, spotted cats, striped cats, white cats, and black cats and all need loving homes. We have cats with a personality that will be the perfect match for your preferences and lifestyle from lap cats to playful cats that will make you laugh,” said Brittany Farrell, adoption manager at Nevada Humane Society.

Everyone who adopts a cat in June will receive a free “*Adopt a Cat*” static-cling sticker with an adorable cat on it for your car window. The stickers will help spread the word about the joy of adopting a cat. Adopters will also get a free Nevada Humane Society t-shirt.

“Summer time always means an increase in adult cats entering animal shelters, but this year, cats are especially vulnerable during these tough economic times,” said Diane Blankenburg, Community Programs Director. “Nevada Humane Society is seeing an increasing number of people who can’t afford to keep their pets. All cats are spayed and neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped before being adopted. These services would normally cost over \$200.
